## Physical Layer Configuration

All parameters in the below table are settable upon command. The customer selected values are the ones the TXS defaults to when no command to update these values is issued. In the table in the column “customer selected value”, please enter the requested value for each parameter.

## Data Link Layer Configuration

TXS transmits downlink data in TM Transfer frames, compliant to CCSDS-132.0-B. The primary header of the TM Transfer Frame contains the Spacecraft Identifier (SCID) which identifies the satellite. SCIDs are assigned by the Spacecraft Assigned Numbers Authority (SANA), see <https://sanaregistry.org> for details on applying for a SCID. If no value is provided, the SCID defaults to 0x000. Note that the SCID value can be set upon command prior to each transmission.

## Electrical Interface Configuration

TXS makes use of a Cubesat Kit Bus (CSKB) – Lite connector (non-stack through) which carries the power and I2C data interface.

### CSKB-lite Pin-out

Even though only one I2C bus is used, there are two alternative sets of pins on the CSKB-lite connectors that could be used to connect to the board.

## Software Configuration

### I2C Protocol Settings

TXS contains two controllers, a supervisor which is always powered, and the MSS microcontroller in the baseband system, which is only powered in “standby” and “TX ON” modes. Both have a unique I2C address and are connected to the I2C housekeeping data interface. The I2C addresses can be any 7-bit number with the exception of reserved addresses, specified in the I2C bus specification ([http://www.nxp.com/documents/user\\_manual/UM10204.pdf](http://www.nxp.com/documents/user_manual/UM10204.pdf)) and listed in the table below.

### Supervisor I2C Watchdog Settings

This watchdog is implemented for safety reasons. If the TXS PSupervisor does not receive any command over I2C for a given duration, TXS will reset itself and go into “Supervisor on only “ mode. This safety measure can be disabled by command if required.

### Modem time to lock parameter

This parameter sets the amount of seconds that the groundstation demodulator needs to acquire a lock on the transmitter signal. During this time interval, TXS transmits idle frames in order to avoid transmitting payload data to an unlocked demodulator on the ground.
